

#### YEAR 7 + YEAR 11 BUDDY PROGRAM > Reflection Focus

On Wednesday of Week 3, the Year 11s met up once again with their new Year 7 buddies to host the second formal gathering for the 7-11 Buddy Program. With 2021 being a 'Year of Service' at Gleeson College, we are excited to build the leadership capacity of our Seniors as they continue to guide the newest students to our community in their transition into high school.

This most recent gathering saw our Year 11 students host a session with their buddy group that focused on reflection. They engaged their buddies to seek feedback on their first few weeks in this new environment. Many shared stories and anecdotes about their favourite subjects and teachers, their happenings during recess and lunch, meeting new friends and experiences of new subjects they have never studied before. Many of our Seniors spoke to the College Calendar to help prepare their younger buddies for some upcoming events. One point of note is the first College Mass of 2021, which may be daunting for those coming into Gleeson College from a non-Catholic primary school, as this will mark their first Catholic Mass. To ease the anxiety around this new experience, the Year 11s began dialogue around what happens during these celebrations and what students do to participate, including those of non-Catholic backgrounds.

Deconstruction and reflection on this session has taken place this week in the senior Faith and Living classes, as the various undertakings within the Buddy Program will contribute to the Year 11 Peer Support assessment that comes later in the year. Our next gathering will take place in Week 6 and will be focused on the Year 7 Camp. Our hope is that this will ease any anxiety about this significant milestone, while building enthusiasm for an event that the future class of 2026 will remember as one of their highlights of their high school journey.








#### INTRODUCING OUR 2021 SPECIALIST PROGRAM COACHES










## YEAR 7 SCIENCE > Get Bunsen Burner Licence - Tick!!

## YEAR 9 FASHION + JEWELLERY > Polymer Clay Designs
















Students have been introduced to the design process and over the past few weeks have been investigating safety, jewellery techniques, and design options to generate their own unique design. They have planned and thought of everything to ensure the product they make is functional and of the best quality!

Last week students implemented all their planning and spent their double lesson working with polymer clay. From lanyard and keyring beads, to stud and dangly earrings, students created patterns, and used shapes and tools to add detail and character to each of their items.

This week students used a variety of jeweller's tools and fastenings to turn their items into functional pieces of jewellery!

#### A BERRY GOOD SCIENCE LESSON > DNA Extraction by Year 10s!



Year 10 Science students were recently exposed to a range of scientific thinking

about DNA. These complex molecules are found inside every cell in our body and instruct all living things how to function. To help demonstrate the relationship between DNA, genes and chromosomes students used models and diagrams to support the theory learnt in class.

Students created models to learn about the sugar-phosphate backbone of DNA and used diagrams to model how DNA replicates via a process called mitosis. When students actively participate in class learning is enhanced. Therefore, using methodology like those used in specialised laboratories, students enjoyed extracting DNA by adding a special solution to break open the cells to mashed strawberries. The solution was then filtered, and the DNA isolated. The students were amazed to see how much DNA is in a strawberry and how it looks like wet cotton wool.

It was fantastic to see the students acquiring new information and take active roles in their learning.





Congratulations to our Open Boys Knockout Cricket Team and Coach Mr Oliver Shattock on their Pool A Round 1 victory against Roma Mitchell Secondary College on Tuesday.

Playing away in hot conditions, Roma won the toss and sent our boys in to bat. Openers Hayden Cesaro (12 HUGHES) and Kane Halfpenny (10 FSBOC) settled nicely and had the tally at 0/54 off 12 overs before Kane was run out. This saw Number 3 David Mapstone (12 HUGHES) come to the crease and not waste any time adding some quick runs to our score, including two massive sixes! Middle order batsman Matthew LeRay (9 DMDAS) ably supported the top order with an admirable 17 runs and Gleeson finished their innings all out for 154. Hayden (53) top-scored with the bat, scoring a patient, well-played half century.

It didn't take long for us to break through their top order, with talented pace bowling pair Jamieson Payne (10 MSGAG) and Hayden keeping their opening batsmen on their toes and struggling to find the boundary. We bowled and fielded well throughout the innings and this restricted Roma to just 68 runs, earning us the first-round victory and a berth in Round 2. Well done to Hayden (pictured) who took a suberb 5/7 and to spinner William Jones (10 HSHLD) who bowled an awesome three-over spell taking 2/8.

# Child + Family Services UNPLUGGED

A workshop to help young people aged 12+ and parents learn how problematic gaming can lead to gambling behaviours and to develop practical strategies to support healthier gaming and internet use.

#### The valuable workshops cover:

- How to create balance, develop alternative interests, and set healthy boundaries in relation to gaming.
- How to identify signs of problematic gaming and gambling and its impacts.
- Game development and the implementation of gambling features ie: micro-transactions, loot boxes, in-app purchases.
- Practical tips and proven strategies to combat problem gaming and gambling behaviours.
- How to manage associated problems (eg: school attendance, sleep issues and difficulty concentrating).

#### **Australian Research**

- Of 1200 SA high school students, 11% have been found to use technology at an unsafe level.
- 10% have of young people are using the Internet for more than nine hours per day.
- By age 15, half of all young people have participated in some type of gambling.
- 54% of games on Facebook include gambling themes.
- Five out of 22 popular video games reviewed met the criteria for gambling including the option to cash out winnings.
