Dear Gleeson Families,

Welcome to Term 3!

Students and staff may have heard me speak about the 'Premiership Term' using a football analogy to describe the importance of Term 3 to our Year 12 students particularly, but also to all students at Gleeson College. It will be an exciting term for many reasons, some of which I will address below.

Subject Selections for 2023

This week our Year 10 and 11 students attended subject choice assemblies where they received information about the process for selecting subjects for 2023. They will select their subjects with the assistance of their teachers and with their families at home, and then attend course counselling appointments with their parents to finalise their choices.

Families of our Year 10-12 students will attend our annual Curriculum & Careers Expo Evening next Wednesday. The main tertiary education providers will be present, along with Gleeson College staff and old scholars, presenting information about careers and subjects available at the College and the One+ Campus.

Year 12 students will also shortly attend a SATAC assembly where they will be introduced to the process of selecting University and TAFE courses for 2023. It won't be long before they finish formal lessons and start preparing for examinations. Only 10 teaching weeks left!

Year 9 students will go on camp in Week 4 and commence their careers education in the same week. Subject selections will then follow for them and our Year 7 and 8 students.

Student Leadership 2022/23

Soon we will commence the Student Leadership Election process for our new student leaders whose leadership tenure runs from the beginning of Term 4 to the end of Term 3 in the following year. This is an arduous process and a very competitive one which ultimately sees a great group of students step up to serve their community through their leadership skills and vision.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank most sincerely the current student leaders for their outstanding contribution to our community and for the way in which they have worked together so harmoniously. They have set a very high standard for future leaders to follow.

Inaugural Gleeson Music Camp

Friday to Sunday of last week saw the very first Gleeson College Music Camp for students across the college from Year 7 to 12. The students were involved in music workshops, attending performances, motivational sessions with industry experts and producing their own performance over three days. Old scholars of Gleeson College who are now professional musicians or in the industry were key to the success of the camp. They were brilliant in their performances, advice to students and support for their aspirations. It was so moving to hear them pay credit to Gleeson College and especially

Together on the Way

The Archdiocese of Adelaide and the Catholic Church in general, are in the midst of renewal. Last year we commenced the journey with the Diocesan Assembly in September. This assembly brought together hundreds of stakeholders representing Catholics and those associated with Catholic Church facilities e.g., parishes, schools, hospitals, nursing homes, etc. The assembly came up with a large number of recommendations for the Church to consider for the future. This is part of a larger move towards a 'synodal' model of church (please see below). The Diocesan Assembly Recommendations are now being considered by all stakeholders in order to refine the recommendations that are most important for the communities of the Church and for the Church as a whole.

At Gleeson College we are kindly asking our staff, parents/caregivers and students for their opinions on these recommendations. Alesia Sala, our APRIM, will be communicating with you shortly for your input. The aim is to reduce the many recommendations to the top three for our community and the Church at large. The top three recommendations from all communities will then be presented at the 2022 assembly to make the final recommendations for the Adelaide Archdiocese and the Catholic Church in general.

"The term "synodality," which comes from two Greek words roughly meaning "common road," is for Pope Francis a process of consultations between clerics

and lay people that leads to a consensus. It's a devolution of decision making, a dialog, but he insists it's not like a parliament with majority voting.

"I'd define synodality as a new way of being the Church," said Christopher Lamb, Vatican correspondent for the Catholic Weekly The Tablet in London.

"It's a church that puts ordinary people at the center. It's a church in motion, that stops looking inward and looks out. It's less bound up with its bureaucracies and protocol." - Tom Heneghan, 2 Jun 2021, Decoders, World.



At the 2021 Adelaide Diocesan Assembly, over 450 representatives from parishes, schools, communities and agencies gathered to discuss matters of importance named by the people of the Archdiocese of Adelaide in the pre-assembly consultation process. The discussion topics were categorised into the following six themes: Leadership and Leadership Formation; Inclusion and Healing; Parish Life and Liturgy; Faith Formation and Spiritual Development; A Church that Responds to the Cry of the Earth and the Cry of the Poor; Outreach and Accompaniment of Children, Families and Young People. Out of these discussions, the participants developed 255 recommendations to be considered locally, at the diocesan level, at the Plenary Council and at the 2023 international Synod in Rome. The following is a brief description of the recommendations. Read all 255 recommendations at www.adelaidediocesanassembly.org.

These recommendations are now being discerned further by the interim Diocesan Pastoral Council, the Archdiocesan Leadership Team and the Archbishop. Individuals, groups, parishes, schools, communities and agencies are also invited to discern the recommendations in light of their own context.

Summary of Recommendations from the 2021 Diocesan Assembly

Leadership and Leadership Formation	Inclusion and Healing
With Jesus as our model, there must be continued discernment, development and implementation of new models of leadership for clergy and laity, particularly women and young people, to minister and govern collaboratively and synodally in the church today. Greater resources are needed to support the recruitment, training, ongoing formation and well-being of ordained and lay leaders, professional and volunteer. Stronger collaboration between leaders of parishes, schools, agencies and the diocese.	We must recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples by strengthening and expanding good practices and pastoral support. Discerning inclusive reconciliation processes that begin with acknowledgement of the harm and lack of inclusion on behalf of the church and work toward healing. We must commit to being a church of inclusivity, hospitality and welcome to all. We must also continue listening and being in dialogue with others, especially those who have been marginalised by the church and society.
A Church that Responds to the Cry of the Earth and the Cry of the Poor Inspired by our rich tradition in Catholic Social Teaching, and including Pope Francis' writings, each of us has a responsibility to care for Creation and one another. Our homes, schools, parishes and diocesan agencies must commit to action, education, and transformation in the areas of ecological justice, protection of the most vulnerable, peace and reconciliation with First Nations people, and elimination of all injustice. We cannot do this alone, we must collaborate with other communities of faith and in the civic arena.	Faith Formation and Spiritual Development Providing a diversity of accessible, high quality faith formation and spiritual development for all ages and stages of life is a priority. While the faith education and formation of children is desired, there is a particular need for adult formation. Multi-modal resources and professional support must be provided for individuals, families, schools, parishes, and communities. There must be greater collaboration across parishes and schools in the development, sharing and implementation of formation and sacramental programs. Ongoing formation and training of leaders, staff and clergy is vital.
Outreach and Accompaniment of Children, Families and Young People Accompaniment of children, families, and young people means building personal relationships with individuals and developing an understanding of their needs and life situations. We must respond to the needs of children, families and young people by providing new, relevant and accessible ways for them to be in community, to be formed in their faith, and participate in the life, faith and mission of the church.	Parish Life and Liturgy Parishes are central to the expression of the Christian life. To enhance parish life, we must develop strategies, resources and formation for parishes and communities to be places of hospitality, welcome, inclusion and belonging and to become vibrant and joyful. Greater collaboration and communication between schools and parishes. The liturgical and sacramental life of parishes is vital. Diverse liturgical and eucharistic celebrations are needed that reflect the realities of the people in the communities, including music, language, families, ministries and leadership.

Since 2018 when the Plenary Council listening and dialogue process began, continuing with our local consultation for the 2021 Diocesan Assembly, and now the global consultation for the 2023 Synod in Rome, we have been on an ever-expanding synodal journey together. The responses from the various consultations have informed our participation at the Diocesan Assembly and the Plenary Council as we seek to discern God's will for us in this place and time. The feedback and information from the local and national processes will be combined with the responses to the international consultation to be included in the diocesan report to the 2023 international Synod on Synodality. 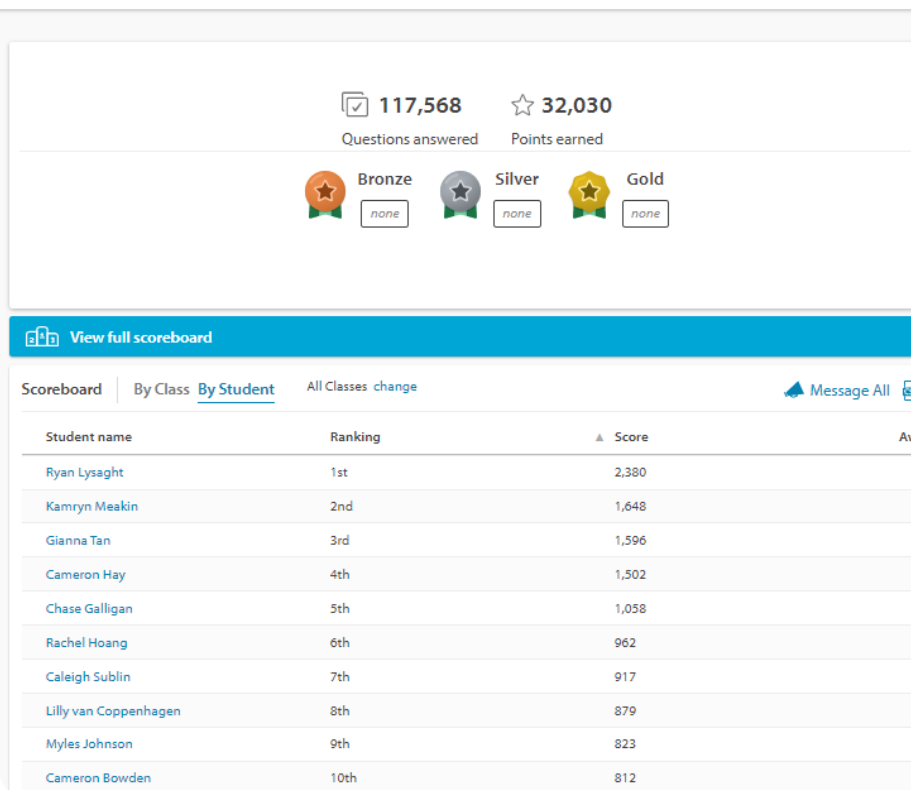

🏆 Year 8 Hiragana Competition



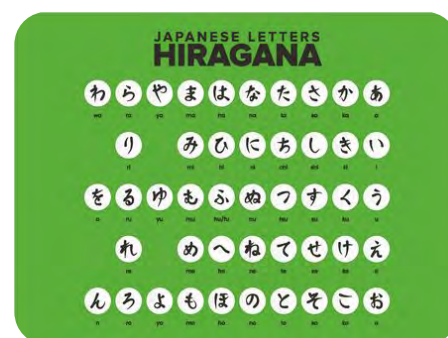
In Term 1, Year 8 Japanese students competed to see who could earn the most points by completing Hiragana Alphabet activities on Education Perfect.

HEXAGONAL THINKING IN HaSS!

The Gleeson College HaSS Faculty are proud Life-Long Learners! Recently, staff member Mr Chris Millowick presented a practical professional development session on 'Hexagonal Thinking': a creative, collaborative, and kinaesthetic teaching tool for finding nuances within the connections between ideas.

In small groups, students are provided with a deck of hexagons, each with a word or concept written on it, and are instructed to create a 'web' of tessellated hexagons. Through discussion, students think critically about each concept and its placement within the web of connections. Afterwards, students justify to their peers why they have chosen certain connections.

The ability to physically rearrange the cards is the power of Hexagonal Thinking, as each concept can have a maximum of six connections.



The choice about each placement is a springboard for debate, as every group will generate a unique web for different reasons.

This teaching method is a fantastic tool for revision of core concepts, consolidation of word banks, and integration of collaborative



critical thinking into the learning environment. The HaSS Faculty were energised by this session and are excited to implement this innovative method of cooperative learning in a variety of contexts.

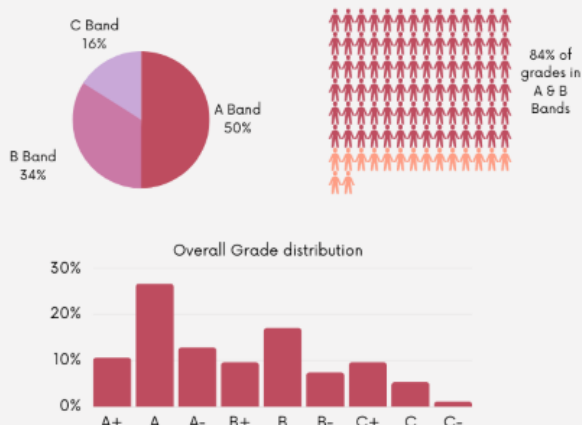

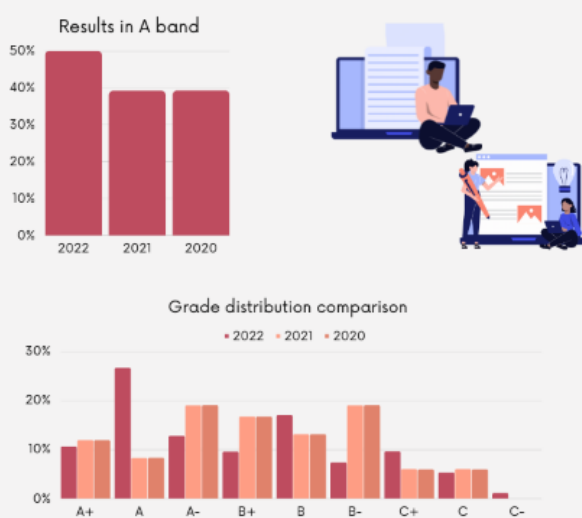
